9. CISOA Technology Excellence Team Award

CISOA Technology Excellence Team Award Victor Valley College IT department has been honored with the CISOA Technology Excellence Team Award for their Remote Operations Response.

In March 2020, like many colleges, VVC found themselves with a fully remote workforce for the first time, and the IT department was forced to find solutions that could reduce risk while maintaining operations. The crisis brought incredible change and obstacles to nearly every part of the college.

Victor Valley IT department was able to adapt quickly and help ensure remote workers have access to the same communications and other resources as they would in the office. The team highlighted the crucial need for the college to reimagine how they can service their students. With an eye toward the future, the team rolled out various technologies like Single Sign On, Virtual Desktop Infrastructure (VDI), Multi Factor Authentication (MFA), Artificial Intelligent Chatbot, Adobe Digital Signature, Zoom and Microsoft Teams and Amazon Virtual Labs.

Victor Valley IT department provided staff and students with an anytime, anywhere working and learning experience.

Again, congratulations and we look forward to honoring the Victor Valley College IT Department at the 2021 CISOA Virtual Technology Summit.





Q1 Are you interested in receiving a COVID-19 vaccine at VVC?





Important Notes:

- VVC positive COVID-19 cases were **down 15%** in January when compared to December.
- VVC Positive COVID-19 cases were down sharply during the second half of January. Positive cases during the last two weeks in January were down 80% when compared to the first two weeks of January. This is most likely due family gatherings over the holiday season.
- The County of San Bernardino is reporting declining numbers in almost all areas. This could partially be due to a decline in numbers tested, although the data regarding ICU capacity is encouraging as well. Ventilators and ICU beds have increased in availability over the past two weeks.
- Within San Bernardino County, the number of people infected by one person has declined to 0.72 - the lowest since the pandemic started. This means on average, each positive case infects 0.72 additional persons. This number has declined 50% since early December.
- The 7 day moving average for number of positive cases throughout San Bernardino County has fallen to the lowest number in almost three months.







