Minimum Qualifications

- All required coursework completed (both general education and sciences)
- Maximum of two withdrawals or incompletes in Anatomy, Micro and Physio
- Anatomy, Micro & Physio completed within 5 yrs. of applying to the program
- No grades lower than a C ("C -" not accepted)
- And a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.
- TEAS score of 70 or above

The 65 qualified applicants with the most points will advance to take the TEAS exam if they have not already done so. Those not in the 65 will need to reapply during a future application period.

TEAS Test

• Prior to applying, applicants may take the TEAS at their own expense. For information on how to register for the TEAS, visit ATItesting.com, create an account, and go to the STORE for registration details. Test results must be sent directly to the VVC Nursing Department by ATItesting.com and must arrive no later than the last day of the application period.

Applicant Selection

Of the 65 qualified applicants who pass the TEAS with a 70 or above on this attempt or who already passed and had their score sent directly to the VVC Nursing Program, the top 40 based on points will start the program the following fall or spring term.

- Those not in that group of 40 will need to reapply
- Those who did not pass the TEAS with a 70 or above will need to retake it at their own expense and reapply.
- VVC only allows two attempts maximum at the TEAS exam
