 KINESIOLOGY (FORMERLY PHYSICAL EDUCATION) REQUIREMENT: A minimum of 1 semester unit is required. Any APE, KIN, KIND course; TA courses that are cross-listed with KIND; the HLTH 102 course; or Military veterans who submit DD214 to Admissions & Records will clear this area. Athletics courses do not fulfill this requirement.
