**INTERSEGMENTAL GENERAL EDUCATION (GE) TRANSFER CURRICULUM (IGETC)**

OBJECTIVE: Completion of all the requirements in the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) permits a student to transfer from a community college to a campus in either the California State University or the University of California system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education courses to satisfy the university's general education requirements.
 EXCEPTIONS: All campuses will accept IGETC except UC Berkeley's Haas School of Business and UC San Diego's Roosevelt and Revelle Colleges. Also, IGETC is not recommended for science, engineering, or other high unit majors at most campuses. These students should follow the gen-

 CERTIFICATION: All areas of the IGETC should be certified prior to transfer. Partial certification may be awarded if all but two (2) courses in any area except Group 1 and 2 are completed. Students are responsible for requesting IGETC certification by completing the "CSU and UC General Education Certification" form available in Counseling.
