Admission to Victor Valley College is governed by the state's laws and such supplementary regulations as having been prescribed by the Board of Trustees.

Under the direction of the Chief Student Services Officer or designee, the Director of Admissions and Records oversees the admission and registration of eligible students. Applications are accepted online and in Admissions & Records. Some instructional programs require a supplemental application in addition to the general college application. Students who have incoming credits must file official transcripts of all high school and/or college work.

Students eligible for admission to the District must be 18 years of age or older, participate as an apprentice as defined in Labor Code (Section 3077), and/or possess a high school diploma, GED, certificate of proficiency, or demonstrate they are capable of profiting from the instruction offered at the College.

Students who previously attended but haven't enrolled in VCC for a year or more (i.e., missing both Fall and Spring semester) shall complete a new admission application.

Each person who applies for admission to a California Community College is classified as a 'resident' or a 'nonresident' for admission and/or tuition purposes. Nonresident students who apply shall pay out-of-state tuition fees until California residency has been established. The District accepts applications from students holding or attempting to obtain the F-1 Student Visa. Nonresident students with visitor's visas are not authorized to apply. (See BP/AP 5015 Residence Determination, BP/AP 5020 Nonresident Tuition, or BP/AP 5012 International Students)

The Chief Instructional Officer shall be responsible for confirming the validity of a student's high school completion if the College or the United States Department of Education has reason to believe that the high school diploma is not valid or was not obtained from an entity that provides secondary school education.

Admissions policies and procedures are published in the college catalog and on the college website.
